The Concordia Climate Change Adaptation Lab is looking to recruit a full-time research assistant for a project titled “Adapting Canada’s housing system to a changing climate: The climate change adaptation-housing nexus.” C-CCAL is a research lab in the Concordia Department of Geography, Planning & Environment led by Dr. Alexandra Lesnikowski and on climate change vulnerability and adaptation governance.

Duties will include:

- Preparation and submission of the ethics application for the research project
- Collection of Canadian social housing data
- Vulnerability analysis of Canadian social housing to climate change risks

Hours and contract dates:

- 35 hours per week
- January 1, 2023 – March 1, 2023 (exact start date flexible)

Necessary qualifications and skills include:

- Interest in climate change policy and housing issues
- Familiarity with Canadian housing data
- Familiarity with climate change risks in Canadian cities
- Strong academic performance
- Ability to manage datasets and develop summary analyses
- Strong organizational skills
- Familiarity with R is an asset
